Transforming Food Systems with a Farmers Driven Climate Agenda THE CLIMAKERS

The latest IPCC report on Climate Change and Land states that Agriculture is responsible for 23% of Greenhouse Gases Emission, however this data does not take into consideration the carbon sequestration contribution of the farming sector.

The ongoing debate about food systems does not consider the whole picture, forgetting to consider, for instance, the effort farmers are putting in maintaining high the soil quality in their daily job, not to mention the potential that farmers have to prevent disasters, only by working the land.

With the Climakers initiative, Farmers worldwide, with the support of the other actors in the food value chain, the civil society, the international organizations, academia and the media, have made the proactive decision to establish a Farmers' Driven Climate Change Agenda to present the actions they are implementing already to mitigate and adapt to the climate change, by replying to the following two questions:

- 1. What actions are you putting in place to mitigate and adapt to the Climate Change?
- 2. What do you need to improve your capacity to mitigate and adapt to the Climate Change?

This event brings together farmers, researchers and the members of the Climakers Alliance to present the findings of the Climakers campaign after one year from its launch at COP24, in Katowice.
